CASE STUDY #3

Sal

Sal was a scavenger on the Siem Reap Dumpsite in Cambodia. She was badly abused by her alcoholic father who is an amputee as a result of the Khmer Rouge wars.

Sal had only one eye due to an accident when she was 8 years old.

She joined the Siem Reap Livestock Training Centre in 2013 as a student farmer. She now lives at the Centre to escape her father and she works there part-time.

In January 2014 the Centre organised a new artificial eye for Sal to enable her to live a normal life.

With the financial assistance secured by Dana Asia she has now gone back to school part-time and also works part-time as an apprentice at the Centre.

Her income as a part-time apprentice is USD50-70/month, doubling her income from scavenging.
